1. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this bid is to invite Service Providers to submit proposals to conduct a Common Impact Measurement System (CIMS) survey for the National Library of South Africa on the Mzansi Libraries On-Line Project (The MLO Project). The MLO Project is implemented by the National Library of South Africa (NLSA) in partnership with the nine (9) Provincial Library Services and the National Department of Arts and Culture; and is funded by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation's Global Libraries Programme.

The Common Impact Measurement System (CIMS) is a unique monitoring and evaluation tool designed by the Global Libraries Programme to measure the impact of the Programme on people's lives. The system uses indicators in the seven Common Impact Measurement System areas, namely:

- Digital Inclusion
- Culture and Leisure
- Education
- Communication
- Economic Development
- Health
- Government and Governance

The collection of impact data through this survey is a core reporting requirement of the Global Libraries Programme. Although data is being collected in all seven CIMS areas, three areas have been selected as the core focus areas for South Africa. These are Education, Health and Economic Development.

2. OBJECTIVES

The NLSA wishes to acquire the services of a knowledgeable, experienced and reputable service provider to conduct a national Common Impact Measurement System survey in line with the Global Libraries Programme's approach to measuring the self-reported impact of the Programme on people's lives. The survey will be conducted by collecting data in three Common Impact Areas from all of the libraries participating in the NLSA's Mzansi Libraries On-Line (MLO) Project.

3. BACKGROUND

Mzansi Libraries On-Line (MLO) is a project of the National Library of South Africa aimed at providing access to information and library services to previously disadvantaged communities. The MLO Project aims to strengthened and enhanced services at public libraries through the provision of technologies, spaces and relevant training for library employees. A total of 667 public libraries in all of the nine provinces in South Africa participate in the project.

The NLSA is implementing the project in collaboration with nine Provincial Library Services. The project is overseen and supported by the Department of Arts and Culture.

A baseline CIMS survey was conducted in 2015, with the MLO Project approaching an end, the second CIMS survey has become due and must be conducted.

Data collected through the CIMS survey will enable public libraries, the library sector and policy makers to focus on the project's impact on the quality of life of the people in the communities served by the selected public libraries.

The survey data will be collected in the following selected impact areas:

1. Education
2. Health
3. Economic development

4. SCOPE OF WORK:

4.1 The Service Provider (SP) will be required to measure the impact on the lives of people served by the MLO Project participating libraries. The SP will design and conduct a Common Impact Measurement System (CIMS) Survey. The survey must be based on the identified impact areas of the MLO Project. The Service Provider will be expected to use the set of CIMS indicators to measure this impact, underpinned by a comprehensive methodology for data collection.

The scope of work includes the following deliverables

- To conduct an end-of-programme CIMS Survey in line with the requirements of the Global Libraries Programme at the participating libraries:

- Develop a robust and comprehensive methodology for the collection of data
- Develop/design appropriate survey tools
- Conduct the CIMS Survey on a sample of at-least 2000 library users across the indicated libraries

- Collect data and report on a set of desired outcomes from the three predetermined impact areas, namely, Education, Health and Economic development
- Analyse the data and interpret the results
- Prepare/Develop a CIMS Survey Report
- Provide the data collected and the results of the Survey to the NLSA

All information related to the CIMS Survey, including the questionnaires, remain the intellectual property of the NLSA. The Service Provider will not be allowed to use any part of the Survey for any other purpose.

5. TIME FRAMES

5.1 Final time frames for this project will be agreed upon in consultation with the successful Service Provider. All work will be carried out as per an official purchase order or Service Level Agreement. The survey and reporting must be completed not later than the February 2019

5.2 On approval/acceptance of the appointment, the Service Provider must be prepared to enter into and sign a Service Level Agreement with the National Library of South Africa (NLSA) in compliance with the procurement policies, procedures and requirements of the NLSA and all other statutory requirements.

6. PROJECT GOVERNANCE & REPORTING

6.1 Project Reporting

- The Service provider will be expected to develop and submit to the NLSA monthly Progress Reports.
- The Service Provider should be available for update meetings as and when required.

7. EVALUATION CRITERIA

7.1 Format of Bids

- The Bid Documents must be completed in full.
- Each page must be initialled by the Bidders' authorised representatives and witnesses.
- All compulsory documents must be provided.

The Bid Evaluation Committee will allocate points out of 100 for functionality according to the criteria set out below. Bidders who fail to score **70 points** for functionality will be considered as having submitted a non-responsive bid and will not be considered for further evaluation.

Bidders who fail to score 70 points for functionality will be considered as having submitted a non-responsive bid and will not be further evaluated.

Bids will be evaluated on a scale of 0 – 5 in accordance with the criteria below. The rating will be as follows:

- 0** = **No evidence**, *Does not comply, no evidence / no reference / no information / no inputs*
- 1** = **Very Poor**, *Information provided does not meet the technical requirements of the bid*
- 2** = **Poor / inadequate**, *No satisfactory information / evidence not enough to substantiate, have not reached 70% of the requirement*
- 3** = **Average**, *satisfactory and comply with at least 70 % of the requirements*
- 4** = **Good** *Fully meet the specification requirement and complies >90 % of the requirement*
- 5** = **Excellent**, *Fully meet the specification requirement and comply 100 % of the requirement with additional innovation, best practice standards and benchmark models*

Bidders are expected to furnish detailed information in substantiation of compliance to the evaluation criteria mentioned below.

THE NATIONAL INDUSTRIAL PARTICIPATION PROGRAMME

INTRODUCTION

The National Industrial Participation (NIP) Programme, which is applicable to all government procurement contracts that have an imported content, became effective on the 1 September 1996. The NIP policy and guidelines were fully endorsed by Cabinet on 30 April 1997. In terms of the Cabinet decision, all state and parastatal purchases / lease contracts (for goods, works and services) entered into after this date, are subject to the NIP requirements. NIP is obligatory and therefore must be complied with. The Industrial Participation Secretariat (IPS) of the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) is charged with the responsibility of administering the programme.

PILLARS OF THE PROGRAMME

1.1 The NIP obligation is benchmarked on the imported content of the contract. Any contract having an imported content equal to or exceeding US\$ 10 million or other currency equivalent to US\$ 10 million will have a NIP obligation. This threshold of US\$ 10 million can be reached as follows:

- (a) Any single contract with imported content exceeding US\$10 million. or
- (b) Multiple contracts for the same goods, works or services each with imported content exceeding US\$3 million awarded to one seller over a 2 year period which in total exceeds US\$10 million. or
- (c) A contract with a renewable option clause, where should the option be exercised the total value of the imported content will exceed US\$10 million. or
- (d) Multiple suppliers of the same goods, works or services under the same contract, where the value of the imported content of each allocation is equal to or exceeds US\$ 3 million worth of goods, works or services to the same government institution, which in total over a two (2) year period exceeds US\$10 million.

1.2 The NIP obligation applicable to suppliers in respect of sub-paragraphs 1.1 (a) to 1.1 (c) above will amount to 30 % of the imported content whilst suppliers in respect of paragraph 1.1 (d) shall incur 30% of the total NIP obligation on a *pro-rata* basis.

1.3 To satisfy the NIP obligation, the DTI would negotiate and conclude agreements such as investments, joint ventures, sub-contracting, licensee production, export promotion, sourcing arrangements and research and development (R&D) with partners or suppliers.

1.4 A period of seven years has been identified as the time frame within which to discharge the obligation.

REQUIREMENTS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF TRADE AND INDUSTRY

2.1 In order to ensure effective implementation of the programme, successful bidders (contractors) are required to, immediately after the award of a contract that is in excess of **R10 million** (ten million Rands), submit details of such a contract to the DTI for reporting purposes.

CERTIFICATE OF INDEPENDENT BID DETERMINATION

- 1 This Standard Bidding Document (SBD) must form part of all bids¹ invited.
