TERMS OF REFERENCE TO REQUEST QUOTATIONS TO SUPPLY FIFTEEN (15) TABLETS AND FIFTEEN (15) COVERS TO THE NATIONAL LIBRARY OF SOUTH AFRICA (NLSA)

1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 The National Library of South Africa, hereafter referred to as NLSA, is a world-class African National Library and Information Hub. The NLSA is responsible for collecting, recording, preserving, and making available the national documentary heritage of South Africa. The NLSA promotes awareness, appreciation, and access to published documents, nationally and internationally, and in doing so contributes to the development and prosperity of South Africa. The NLSA has campuses in Pretoria and Cape Town.
- 1.2 The National Library of South Africa (NLSA) wished to appoint a service provider to supply 15 (fifteen) tablets and 15 (fifteen) covers as specified.
- 1.3 The tablets and covers should be delivered to the NLSA campus in Pretoria.

2. SCOPE OF WORK

2.1 NLSA would like to source quotations for the supply of fifteen (15) tablets and fifteen (15) rugged covers.

2.2 All the tablets must have the following specifications:

- Size: 12 inches
- Colour: 16.7 million colours
- Type: TFT LCD (IPS), up to 120 Hz refresh rate 60/120 Hz smart refresh rate
- Touch Screen: Multi-touch, supports a maximum of 10 contact points
- PROCESSOR: Qualcomm® Snapdragon™ 7 Gen 1 Mobile Platform
- MEMORY ROM:128 GB*
- RAM:6 GB*
- Rear Camera:13 MP (f/1.8 aperture, AF)
- Front Camera:8 MP (f/2.2 aperture, fixed focal length)
- CHARGING: Standard charger: 10V/2.25A charger
- Quick charging: The tablet supports 10V/2.25A (Max) fast charging and is compatible with 9V/2A fast charging.
- Wi-Fi:802.11a/b/g/n/ac/ax, 2 × 2 MIMO, HE160

3. NLSA'S RIGHTS

3.1 The NLSA is entitled to amend any RFQ conditions, RFQ validity period, RFQ terms of reference, or extend the RFQ's closing date, all before the RFQ closing date. All Bidders, to whom the Bid documents have been issued and where the NLSA has a record of such Bidders, may be advised in writing of such amendments in good time and any such changes will also be posted on the NLSA's website under the relevant Bid information. All prospective Bidders must, therefore, ensure that they visit the website regularly and before they submit their Bid response to ensure that they are kept updated on any amendments in this regard.

4. DURATION OF THE PROJECT

4.1.1 The appointed service provider shall supply NLSA with tablets and covers within 7 (seven) days after a Purchase Order is issued as per the specifications in the RFQ.

5. CONDITIONS OF RFQ

5.1 The NLSA reserves the right not to accept the lowest proposal.

5.2 The NLSA reserves the right to appoint one or more Bidder.

5.3 The NLSA reserves the right not to award the contract.

5.4 The NLSA reserves the right to have any documentation, submitted by the successful Bidder checked or inspected by any other person or organisation.

5.5 The General Conditions of Contract will apply to this Bid.

5.6 The NLSA will not be held responsible for any costs incurred by the Bidder in the preparation and submission of the Bid.

5.7 The Bidder may be required to prepare for a possible presentation should the NLSA require such and Bidder shall be notified thereof in good time before the actual presentation date. Such presentation may include a practical demonstration of products or services as called for in this Bid.

5.8 No upfront Payment will be made by NLSA.

5.9 The quotations shall remain valid for a period of 60 days and may be extended at the discretion of the NLSA.

6. EVALUATION CRITERIA

6.1 Pre-evaluation

6.1.1 Fully completed SBD 4, SBD 6.1 forms.

6.1.2 All Bidders must be registered on the National Treasury Central Supplier Database (CSD) and must attach a copy of the most recent report.

7. PRICING

7.1.1 Preference Point System

In terms of Regulation, 5 of the Preferential Procurement Regulations of 2022/23, Gazette Number 47452 dated 4 November 2022 about the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework

2000 (Act 5 of 2000) responsive bids will be adjudicated by the State on the 80/20-preference point in terms of which points are awarded to bidders based on :

- The bid price (maximum 80 points)
- Specific Goals (maximum of 20 points):

$$P_s = 80 \left(1 - \frac{P_t - P_{\min}}{P_{\min}} \right)$$

7.1.2 Bid price

The following formula will be used to calculate the points out of 80 for price in respect of an invitation

for a tender, inclusive of all applicable taxes.

7.1.3 Specific Goals (maximum of 20 points): -

20 points for 100% Black-owned companies,

10 points if the company is not 100% black-owned.

The Central Supplier Database report will provide evidence of Black Ownership status.
